

Task 5.3 Training and webinar plan overview

To ensure effective knowledge transfer, FCAC will coordinate a series of training events (17 physical and 11 knowledge transfer webinars) and associated materials during the AgriLoop project.

After an extensive consultation with the AgriLoop consortium, please see table 2 for the proposed training and webinar plan.

Types of training

Training activities will consist of:

Training events: Are educational and usually involving practical activities that engage a group of people. Training events provide skills and knowledge while also engaging participants by providing a chance to work together towards a common goal. In the AgriLoop project context, training events will be face-to-face, organised in different countries, and led by national WPs or task leaders. These events will be oriented towards different target audiences: academia, farmers, end users, industry, and policymakers.

In AgriLoop we will carry out 13 training events (in-person).

Learning Workshop: A workshop is typically a brief, intensive educational program for a small group. Workshops can happen online or in person, and they can also function as a hybrid of in-person and digital event. The main characteristics of learning workshops are to be more participative and include more networking. Being face-to-face, learning workshops complement the work with technical visits, demonstrative days, and other events that promote networking and some other aspects of the job, such as building new strategies and projects.

The learning workshops of AgriLoop are planned to be face-to-face, with the idea of gathering people from the same region or country to focus on specific practical techniques and skills in a particular field and give an in-depth look at a knowledge area or a designated focus. These events will be planned to be carried out towards the end of the project, as a complement to the dissemination of results. The target groups for these events will be complementary EU and CN projects.

In AgriLoop we will carry out 4 Learning Workshops.



Webinar: A webinar is a short seminar or presentation that can be streamed online by viewers. A webinar is exclusively an online event, so it offers a way for someone or a group to connect with attendees and impart information. Participants usually register and join via a personalised link sent by the host. During the webinar, they can see and hear the presenter, view slides and other media, participate in live chat, ask questions, answer polls, etc. Presentations are often followed by live Q&A sessions in which audiences can ask questions. In these kinds of events, the interaction between participants is limited. In the context of AgriLoop, webinars will be used mainly to broadcast knowledge, with the advantage of making it possible to reach larger audiences from different regions and countries. Task and WP leaders with the help of partners will organise these events. As training events, these will be oriented toward different targets: academia, farmers, end users, industry, and policymakers.

In AgriLoop we will carry out 11 webinars.

All face-to-face events can invite groups from other EU and CN projects; webinars can establish this link with other European and Chinese projects if it is thought that it will increase the webinar's impact and reach.

Involving academia

Research institutes and universities will involve students from Masters and PhD courses in the organisation of project training events and promote the organisation of a student European and Chinese network. This network will work in practical and methodological aspects of bioeconomy not only at academy but also at business and industrial level.

Academic and RTO partners will be encouraged to hold summer schools and open days targeted at younger audiences, for example, possibly as part of the ITQB NOVA Summer Science weeks or other academic university and technical school's events.

Inclusivity

In the structure of the training plan, gender dimension will be considered in the selection of the leader of the different events, as well as in the recruitment of both speakers and delegates. Gender diversity will feature in promotion of the events.

Collaborating with other international projects and events

The strategy for collaborations with other projects is to identify the most interesting for our goals and will be based on the identification of ERASMUS, HORIZON EUROPE, and OPERATIONAL GROUPS (EIP-Agri) or other Chinese and wold wide projects related to bioeconomy, agriculture, farmers, training, education, entrepreneurship, and innovation in rural areas that have been previously selected by our consortium (Table 1).

At least one event will also be held in conjunction with an established conference, expo or workshop, which attracts a relevant audience of industry, agriculture and/or academics, such as the Renewable Resources and Biorefineries Conference, Agricultural Waste Treatment & Utilisation Expo or Chinese and World Bio Markets.



This vision is to connect AgriLoop aspects related to the application of new business models in the bioeconomy frame (WP4) and include workings to find solutions to needs and problems in farmer production, agriculture, and rural area development.

After an agreement between the WP5 EU team and Chinese Coordinator discussing a common training plan strategy, an unified common EU and CN training plan is presented in this document.

The WP5 coordinator (BDC) and FCAC will work with a graphic design agency if necessary to develop a template for training materials, so that all materials have a consistent format. Materials will be developed to support training activities. They will be tailored for each event and include PowerPoint presentations, videos, case studies and handouts. These templates will be available for all partners in the training and webinar folder in the SharePoint.



Available budget

The budget available for the organisation of the training events and webinars is limited. Please can partners communicate to the WP5, team their specifics costs if needed for event organisation. The following categories can be financed **according to the GA**.
